

God used a rainbow as a sign of his covenant with Noah and all living creatures to never again flood the earth. Are there some additional signs in your life of God's love for us?




Second Reading:

# Mass at a Glance

# Part 15: "But Only Say The Word And My Soul Shall Be Healed"

The first portion of the communion rite reminds us that the Eucharist is what unites us as the Body of the Church and calls us to pray for forgiveness and deliverance from sin. The last portion takes up this theme, beginning with the Fractioning Rite. The priest takes up the Sacred Host, breaks it in half, and puts a portion of the host in the chalice. The GIRM states, "The gesture of breaking bread done by Christ at the Last Supper, which in apostolic times gave the entire Eucharistic Action its name, signifies that the many faithful are made one body (1 Cor 10:17) by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life, which is Christ, who for the salvation of the world died and rose again." It also represents the brokenness of our Lord's body on the cross and the act of placing a piece in the chalice represents the unity of the Body and Blood of Christ.

During the fractioning, the people sing the prayer called the Angus Dei, or "Lamb of God". This prayer, stemming from ancient times, has always been closely associated with the fractioning of the Sacred Host. This acclamation and its ties to the breaking of the Host call to mind again the Passion and Death of Christ, the Lamb of God, by which he gave himself in sacrifice to take away our sins. It also evokes the image of the Lamb of the Book of Revelation. The invocations of "have mercy on us" and "grant us peace" draw the people to beg for forgiveness and mercy from God once again.

Following the fractioning, the priest prays one of two prayers silently, both of which call the priest to individually ask pardon and mercy for his own sins as he prepares to receive the precious Body and Blood of Christ. These prayers are to be recited silently, as they are prayers of personal preparation, meant only for the priest and God alone to hear. Meanwhile, if the Agnus Dei has concluded, all the people kneel and pray silently to prepare themselves for Holy Communion. The text of both priest prayers is provided here for your personal knowledge and meditation:

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who, by the will of the Father and the work of the Holy Spirit, through your Death gave life to the world, free me by this, your most holy Body and Blood, from all my sins and from every evil; keep me always faithful to your commandments, and never let me be parted from you.

May the receiving of your Body and Blood, Lord Jesus Christ, not bring me to judgment and condemnation, but through your loving mercy be for me protection in mind and body and a healing remedy.

When completed, the priest genuflects, rises, then lifts the Host or the Host and chalice for the people to see, saying, "Behold the Lamb of God..." Again, we are drawn to the Lamb of God imagery, who died to take away our sins, but now with an explicit reference to Revelation: "Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." The Eucharist we celebrate and partake of is a foretaste of the heavenly banquet to come. All the people, and the priest, respond with the famous words of the centurion, words of great humility but also deep trust in the power of Christ to heal us: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."
