

Court Massabielle, Catholic Daughters of the Americas Donates to Sacred Heart Church


Sacred Heart is very grateful for the generous donation made by The Catholic Daughters of the Americas in helping with the replacement of chairs for our cafeteria! Thank you!

**Sharing the Gospel** When the Hebrews sinned in the desert, snakes came to bite them. Moses lifted up a metal snake in the desert. If God's people looked at the metal snake, their painful snake bites would be healed. Instead of

dying from their snake bites, they would live. Our sins are a lot like those snake bites. Sins turn us away from God, hurt us, and hurt other people. When Jesus was lifted up on the cross, he washed our sins away. Jesus gave us healing and for-



giveness. We don't need to die from our sins. We can believe in Jesus, follow God with our whole hearts, and live forever.



**<u>Prayer</u>** God, thank you for sending Jesus to wash away my sins.

**Something to Draw** a picture of Jesus on the cross. Around the cross, write down your sins in pencil, then erase them. This will show that Jesus has washed all of your sins away.

Mission for the Week Help your parents wash dishes. As you take dirty dishes and wash them clean, talk about how Jesus washed our sins away on the cross.

### Mass at a Glance—Part 18: "Go, It is Over."

The Rite of Communion ends with two actions: the purification of the sacred vessels and the Prayer after Communion. The sacred vessels (chalices and ciboria) which hold the Sacred Eucharist are meant to be handled with extreme care. As such, and out of respect for the Sacred Species, they are purified in a liturgical manner before they may ever be cleaned in conventional ways. By pouring some water into the ciboria and chalices used for Mass, the priest, deacon, or acolyte allow the small amounts of Sacred Body and Blood to be dissolved, so that they may then reverently consume them, thus "purifying" the vessels. They are then dried with the purificators designated for use with sacred vessels. The prayer accompanying this act highlights that the Eucharist is not only sacred food for earthly life but a pledge for the journey to eternity: "What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what has been given to us in time may be our healing for eternity." (Roman Missal, no. 137) After a period of silence, the Priest, either from the chair or the altar, invites the people to stand and pray with the acclamation, "Let us pray", then prays the Prayer after Communion for that day's Mass, which typically begs God to allow the graces and mysteries received in the Eucharist to grow in us and strengthen us for our mission.

At this point, the General Instruction gives a space for brief announcements or statements. Then, once they are concluded or if none are made, the Priest or Bishop presiding gives the people a blessing. He solemnly calls them to attention with the exchange, "The Lord be with you. /And with your spirit," and then he blesses the people in the name of the Holy Trinity. In some circumstances and seasons, the presider may choose to use a more solemn blessing or a prayer over the people, which is distinguished from a normal blessing by the Deacon's invitation to the people: "Bow down for the blessing." These special blessings are usually a set of three prayers each ending with the people responding, "Amen," or one prayer over the people with the "Amen," both of which are concluded with the presider pronouncing the Trinitarian blessing at the conclusion.

Following the blessing, the people are formally dismissed by the presider or a deacon. There are 4 different formulas given, but all contain some form of the command for the people to "Go." The traditional formula in Latin for dismissal is "Ite missa est", which is translated in the Missal as "Go forth, the Mass is ended." However, it more literally translates to something to the effect of "Go, it is over/it is sent." There is meant to be a sense of finality and an urgency in the command. When the Mass ends, the people are commanded to then go out and fulfill the mission of their baptism, to "Go and make disciples of all nations." (Matt. 28:19) The Mass ends somewhat abruptly, partially because the work is not finished; from here, the people must bring the mysteries they have received and incarnate them into the world. This is further expounded by the lack of fanfare the rubrics of the Mass give to the finish of the Mass. There is no indication given for hymns or songs of any kind after the dismissal (though it has become popular to add), nor any indication of a procession out. The work of glorifying God and sanctifying humanity is not complete until it leaves the Church doors. The last instruction given is for the presider and deacons attending with him to kiss the altar as they did when entering the sanctuary at the beginning of Mass, and thus all are to go out to proclaim Christ to the world and bring others to the waters of Baptism, by which they are then led to the eternal table of the Eucharist.
