



### **HOLY WEEK** AT SACRED HEART CHURCH

The Final Week of Lent encapsulates the most sacred celebrations of the Church year, where we celebrate liturgically our Lord Jesus Christ' Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Four main days of celebration mark this important week:

Palm Sunday March 24 - Mass Schedule: 4:30 p.m. (Sat.), 8 & 11 a.m., 6 p.m. On this day, we celebrate our Lord's triumphal entry into the city of Jerusalem before the Passover and His eventual Passion. In the liturgy, the people receive palm branches which are then blessed. At the principal Mass of a parish Church (11 a.m. at Sacred Heart), a solemn procession takes place where the people imitate the crowds proceeding Jesus into the city. Then the account of the Passion is read, in which all the people participate.

Holy Thursday March 28 - 7 p.m. Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper The night before he died, Jesus ate the Passover with his closest disciples, where he instituted the Holy Priesthood and the Eucharist. In the Evening Mass of this day, we commemorate the Last Supper through the washing of feet and a solemn procession of the Blessed Sacrament. This procession ends at an altar of repose, where the faithful are invited to stay and spend some time in Adoration of Christ, imitating Jesus and his apostles praying in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Good Friday March 29 - 3 p.m. Celebration of the Passion of Christ This is the day of our Lord's Death on the Cross for our salvation from sin and death. On this day, Mass is not allowed to be celebrated, but instead a Solemn Passion Service is celebrated. The people participate in the proclaiming of the Lord's Passion according to the Gospel of John and show their love for Jesus through the Solemn Veneration of the Cross.

Holy Saturday/Easter Sunday March 30 - 8 p.m. Paschal Vigil in the Holy Night; March 31 - 8 & 11 a.m. The sorrow of Holy Saturday gives way to the joy of the Resurrection, where Christ rose from the dead and "broke the prison bars of death." (Easter Proclamation) Following ancient tradition, the Paschal Vigil is celebrated Holy Saturday night, where the Paschal Candle is blessed by the Sacred Proclamation and the faithful renew their baptismal promises. It is the most special, different, and sacred celebration of the Church year, as we celebrate the promise of resurrection.
