

#### A Little Bit of History—Sacred Heart of Jesus, Morgan City

The construction of our beloved church from the ground breaking in 1902 to the completion required 22 years of sacrifice. Step by step Fr. Andrew Souby, Pastor, gave his all, in every respect, for the greater glory of God. He would do any work needed, such as unloading bricks, doing carpentry work, cooking and feeding the poor during the great depression, landscaping, choosing and planting the oak trees on the property. The statue of the dead Christ that is now under the Main Altar was purchased by Fr. Andrew Souby in 1903. He wrote in his notes that he stored it in a box in the sacristy. It was carried by men on Good Friday and placed before the altar of the Blessed Virgin. Fr. Souby knew one day the statue was to repose beneath the beautiful Main Altar of the completed church. After a two year period where no work had been done on the church because of lack of funds, the work began again in July of 1904. As a priest, he left to the congregation of the future a pictorial history of faith in the stained glass. A walk through Sacred Heart Church reveals the story of man from the "Expulsion of Adam and Eve" to the apostles of the four gospels– Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Windows are also dedicated to the saint and Savior whose protection was sought by congregations throughout the history of the church in Morgan City– St. Clothilde and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In 1906 the windows arrived from the firm of G.G. Riordan, Cincinnati. In the baptistry, most of the windows are a record in glass, memorials to his beloved family.




