


## Part 2: The Sanctuary and the Church

In his first letter, St. Peter says to the Christian faithful, "Come to him, to that living stone, rejected by men but in God's sight chosen and precious; and like living stones be yourselves built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." (1 Pet. 2:4-5) From this foundation and further places in Scripture, Christians from earliest times always understood that the physical church buildings physically represent the spiritual reality of the Church, the Body of Christ. This is why the construction, ornamentation, and care of churches are so crucial in the life of the church, as caring for the church building in a real way reminds us of the need to care for our own selves, body and soul. In the reverence and respect, we give to the physical house of God we remind ourselves to care and respect the temple of our own bodies as well as those of our neighbors, an to show respect to our Holy Mother, the Church universal.

In addition, the church building is meant to be a microcosm of the Christian reality., by which we are reminded of the goal to which the whole Church strives eternal life with God. This is most evident in the care that is taken of the sanctuary, the area of the church in which the altar of sacrifice rests and where the majority of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is carried out. In the theology of church architecture, the sanctuary is meant to represent the heavenly realms, as the Eucharist is the pledge of that heavenly banquet that awaits in the world to come. Because of this, the Church asks that the sanctuary of any church be constructed in a way to be distinguished and dignified. The General Instruction reads as follows: "It should be appropriately marked off from the body of the church either by its being somewhat elevated or by a particular structure and ornamentation." (GIRM 295)

There are different ways to accomplish this task. Some churches have the sanctuary raised up on steps or platforms to place it higher, which echoes the understanding of the heavenly realms as a higher plane of reality, the place where God dwells. Some decorate the sanctuary with beautiful materials, such as laying a floor of shrining material (marble, terrazzo, etc.) to symbolize the "glassy sea" spoken of in the Book of Revelation. (Rev. 4:6) Other places construct ornate furnishings, such as the altar and candlesticks, to represent the throne of God and the golden bowls. (See Rev. 4) Here at Sacred Heart the sanctuary is raised to signify its importance and symbolism.

However, it is achieved, the main takeaway is that we don't simply enter any other building when we enter a church. It is a sacred structure meant to call to mind our earthly pilgrimage of the Christian life which is meant to end in our true homeland in the new heavens and new earth that awaits. By means of sacred signs and symbols, especially in the arrangement of the sanctuary, our hearts and minds are drawn upwards towards heaven, where we will be with God forever. And so, the church building, especially the sanctuary, are meant to be treated with the utmost respect and reverence, as we would respect our own bodies. This is the place where God dwells and desires to meet us, so let us approach our visits to our local church as it is, a visit to the house of God and our longed-for homeland in heaven.
