

Mass at a Glance

Part 3: Sunday


In the Jewish law, much of life centered around the Sabbath, the seventh day of creation on which God rested (Gen. 2:2-3) and the seventh day of the week (which is Saturday for us today). This was a the holiest day of the week for the Jews, as God enshrined this day as holy in the Ten Commandments: "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work; but the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; in it you shall not do any work...for in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and hallowed it." (Exod. 20:8-11) This was not only a day of rest, but the primary day of worship for the Jewish people.

Our Lord Jesus Christ then presents us with a new reality in His resurrection from the dead. As the Scriptures relate, He rose from the dead "toward the dawn of the first day of the week," (Matt. 28:1) which is Sunday morning. As the bedrock on which our faith rests, Christians from the beginning, following the example of the apostles, began to celebrate the first day of the week as the preeminent day of worship, as evidence in the scriptures to the Christians gathering for "the breaking of the bread" on the first day. (cf. Acts 20:7-12) As Pope Innocent I wrote in the fifth century, "We celebrate Sunday because of the venerable resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, and we do so not only at Easter but also at each turning of the week."



So in the Church, Sunday has become the new Sabbath and the Lord's Day, the day of resurrection as many Eastern Churches call it. Even though the liturgies of the Church, especially the Mass, can be celebrated on most days of the week, the Masses and liturgies which take place on Sunday are held in highest regard, which is why the Church binds all Catholics of able body to attend the Mass on Sundays and holy days. (Code of Canon Law, canon 1247) Sunday is not only the Lord's day, but the day of the church, or, perhaps more accurately, the day in which we truly ARE Church. I will end this reflection by quoting Pope St. John Paul II's "Apostolic Letter on Keeping the Lord's Day Holy" (entitled *Dies Domini*):

As I have noted elsewhere, among the many activities of a parish, "none is as vital or as community-forming as the Sunday celebration of the Lord's Day and his Eucharist"...The Sunday assembly is the privileged place of unity: it is the setting for the celebration of the sacramentum unitatis which profoundly marks the Church as a people gathered "by" and "in" the unity of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. (*Dies Domini* 35-36)

With the help of your gracious presence, may we offer a sacrifice that is right and acceptable in the presence of the most high and undivided Trinity. Amen.
