
THE CHURCH BELLS AND CLOCK


"January 1, 1926, the day the bells were officially blessed by Rev. J.M. Laval, Auxiliary Bishop of New Orleans. The special ceremony was a grand one, attended by a very large crowd from the entire community. Two weeks later the clock was installed. Father Souby said it was "the largest and finest clock in the whole country" between New Orleans and the Texas border. The people are jubilant over it!" It remains a landmark even today.

E.W. Vanduzen Co. of Cincinnati, Ohio was the foundry in charge of casting the four church bells. The largest bell weighing 2000 lbs. was donated by Messers. Paul Kurzweg and Nick H. Breaux. It was christened "Louise" and bears the inscription "Pater Noster." The second bell, weighing 900 lbs., was a gift of Honorable M.E. Norman, Mayor of Morgan City, in memory of his good friend, the then late Dr. Roussel of Patterson. This bell is named "Ave Maria." The "Credo," third bell, weighing 600 lbs., was a gift of J.L. Bertin. The smallest bell, weighing 450 lbs., is named "Gloria in Excelsis Deo," was donated by attorney C.A. Blanchard.



#### Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

#### **First Reading** Ez 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

The angel brought me back to the entrance of the temple, and I saw water flowing out

from beneath the threshold of the temple toward the east, for the façade of the temple was toward the east; the water flowed down from the southern side of the temple, south of the altar. He led me outside by the north gate, and around to the outer gate facing the east, where I saw water trickling from the southern side.
