



# Mass at a Glance Part 5: Introductory Rites I

In the Scriptures and in the Church's tradition, the Christian people are described as a people on pilgrimage, awaiting the arrival in our final homeland with the Lord. St. Paul says, "our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ." (Phil. 3:20) And in the Catechism, speaking about the Mass, it reads, "Having passed from this world to the Father, Christ gives us in the Eucharist the pledge of glory with him. Participation in the Holy Sacrifice identifies us with his Heart, sustains our strength along the pilgrimage of this life, makes us long for eternal life, and unites us even now to the Church in heaven, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints." (CCC 1419)

The entrance procession of Mass is meant to represent this reality of the Christian life. As all rise, the priest and other ministers make their way in a formal procession to the sanctuary, the physical manifestation of heaven. When there are enough servers to do so, the crucifix and two candles, which symbolize Christ the light of the world, lead the procession to show that Christ leads us towards eternity. Following a common practice dating back at least as far as the 4<sup>th</sup> century A.D., the priest (and deacon if one is present) goes up and kisses the center of the altar, which is a real symbol of Christ himself within the liturgy.

In order to remind ourselves of the specifically religious nature of the gathering we are participating in, the Mass is begun by all signing themselves in the form of the cross, while the priest calls upon the name of the Holy Trinity, mindful that we gather to worship God the Father through His Son in the unity of the Holy Spirit. Then the priest greets the people directly with a few predetermined phrases, all lifted in part or whole from the letters of St. Paul, the most common of which is "The Lord be with you." These greetings are meant to be a reminder of to the people of the Lord's presence among them as the Mass begins, whereas the response of the people, "And with your spirit.", is more than just a customary response, but a reminder to the priest of his role of standing in the person of Christ as Head of the Church (Latin: *in persona Christi capitis*), which is why the response was updated to this in the new translation of the Missal in 2011.

At this point, there is a space given where the priest may give some general introduction to the Mass of the day. However, the rubrics of the Mass are clear: "After the greeting of the people, the Priest, or the Deacon, or a lay minister may very briefly introduce the faithful to the Mass of the day." (GIRM 50) The purpose of this space is very specific and is meant to be brief. This is so that the general flow of the Mass is not broken unnecessarily or drawn out longer than needed. Thus it is described as an introduction and on two different occasions called to be brief. (GIRM 50 and 124)

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money-changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his Body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.


