





# Mass at a Glance - Part 6: Introductory Rites II


While celebrating the Paschal Mystery where Christ "broke the prison bars of death," we also recognize that there is a reason that this Mystery was needed: sin. As Psalm 130 states, "If thou, O LORD, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand?" We are redeemed from original sin in Baptism, but the consequences of original sin, namely the inclination to sin, still plague human nature. Therefore, we need to constantly seek conversion and mercy, and thus the Mass begins, after the greeting, with a public admission of our being sinners, which is called the Penitential Act.

This is not the same as sacramental Confession, and carries no absolution, which is why anyone conscious of unconfessed mortal or grave sins must seek the Sacrament of Penance before approaching the altar. The Penitential act is simply a humble confession by the gathered faithful of our sinfulness. The priest then concludes the Act with the prayer "May Almighty God...", which is meant to be said without any additional action. It has been custom at times for some to cross themselves at these words, but these words have never been accompanied by a signing of oneself, either in the current form of the Mass or in the Mass of 1962, as these words do not constitute a blessing nor an absolution. Therefore, no sign of the cross should be made during these words.

This attitude of humility continues with the recitation of the *Kyrie eleison*, or in English "Lord, have mercy." This portion of the Mass has been preserved from ancient times from when the predominant language of the people was still Greek. The two petitions that accompany this prayer, Kyrie eleison ("Lord, have mercy") and Christe eleison ("Christ, have mercy") echo the sentiments of humility of several central figures of the Gospels, such as the ten lepers cleansed by Jesus. (Luke 17:13) In our form of the Mass whose original language is mostly in Latin, this is the only regular prayer within it that is originally in Greek. This prayer, usually carried out by the people repeating the invocations after the priest or the choir/cantor, is said after the Penitential Act unless it is said as a part of the third option called the "Tropes" ("You were sent to heal the contrite of heart, Lord, have mercy...").

After making a humble confession of our sins, we then move to give praise to God through the Gloria (English: "Glory to God"). This ancient prayer, which begins with the direct reference from the prayer of the angels in the shepherd's field (see Luke 2:14), is placed after the penitential act as a hymn of praise to God for his mercy and a reminder of the saving action by which the Son of God became man in the Incarnation to save us.

The Introductory Rites conclude with a prayer prayed by the presiding priest, which is called the Collect. The name of this prayer is not accidental. The purpose of the prayer is for the priest to gather (or collect) the prayers of the people together and express them to God through one prayer that summarizes the direction of prayer for the Mass of the day. This is why he begins with "Let us pray", inviting the people to silently collect their intentions and spiritually unite their intentions to the prayer of the priest. This is also the first of the "presidential prayers", which are prayers prayed by the priest by virtue of his acting as presider in the person of Christ on behalf of the people. The priest prays the prayer with his hands spread in front of him, a gesture called the "orans posture" and one which signifies his specific role of priest.



## Prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary before Mass

O Mother of devoted love and mercy, most blessed Virgin Mary, with all my heart and all my affection I take refuge in you, though I am a poor and undeserving sinner. You stood by your most dear Son as he was hanging on the cross. Stand mercifully by me, poor sinner though I am, and by all the priests who today offer this sacrifice, here and in all our holy Church. With the help of your gracious presence, may we offer a sacrifice that is right and acceptable in the presence of the most high and undivided Trinity. Amen.
