




#### Part 4: Vestments

There is a popular expression which reads, "Dress for the job you want, not the one you have." Basically, it means that how we dress can speak to how we see ourselves and how we wish others to view us. While often we dress for practical reasons often, our dress can have a symbolic value to it as well, much like in this expressions example of directing our career path.

There is a similar principle at work when we consider the role of liturgical vestments, the clothing worn by clergy and ministers in carrying out sacraments and liturgy. In the Old Testament law, divine worship carried out by the priests required them to wear certain sacred garments. (See Exod. 28 and Lev. 8) St. Paul makes reference to the need for Christians to "put on" Christ like a garment, meaning that we must leave behind our old self and embrace life in Christ. (See Rom. 13:13-14) And finally, the twenty-four elders in the Book of Revelation are presented as priests, wearing priestly vestments. (See Rev. 4-5) So putting on new, specially designated clothing, especially for worship and liturgy, is present in the Christian thought and practice from the earliest times.

The vestments that priests, deacons, and other ministers (like adult acolytes and altar servers) are required to wear symbolize that they are entering into a sacred act. It even symbolizes that they are entering a new reality, piggy-backing off what was said in a previous article, namely that the sanctuary of the church represents the heavenly realms. Therefore, priests in the early Church began wearing more costly and precious garments than ordinary clothing to preside over the Eucharist, which naturally led to the eventual development of a stylized form of clothing specifically designed for use in liturgy. Entering into the Mass is entering into a different realm of reality, and the vestments worn express this truth in a distinct and beautiful way.


The vestments worn also have different meanings. You can see this in the vesting prayers a priest may say while putting on his vestments. For instance, the amice, a rectangular cloth worn under the white Alb to cover the priest's normal clothing, is a symbol of the "helmet of salvation." (Eph. 6:17) The Alb, which is the wrong white robe, harkens to the crowds in Revelation, whose white robes were washed white in the blood of the Lamb, (See Rev. 7:14) and symbolize purity. The maniple, the colored vestment worn on the arm, is a reminder of the toils of the Christian life which lead to the glory of heaven. All in all, the vestments worn at Mass remind us that we are participating in a sacred action and anticipating the sacred wedding banquet with God in eternity.
